LOCATION OF POSITIONS/VACANCIES:

There is currently one vacancy in the title of Civil Engineer located at the Town of Ithaca. The eligible list resulting from this open competitive examination may be used to fill any full-time, part-time or temporary vacancy that may occur during the life of the eligible list.

THE USE OF A QUIET HAND-HELD CALCULATOR IS RECOMMENDED FOR THIS EXAMINATION.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: EITHER:

1. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State approved four-year college or university with a bachelor's degree in Engineering **OR**
2. Graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State approved two-year college with an associate degree in Engineering related field **AND** two years of experience in a position involving engineering related work; **OR**
3. Graduation from high school or possession of high school equivalency diploma **AND** six years of experience in a position involving engineering related work; **OR**
4. Any equivalent combination of training and experience as described in (a), (b), or (c) above.

ANTICIPATED ELIGIBILITY (FOR MINIMUM QUALIFICATION 'A' ONLY):

If you are enrolled in a Bachelor's Degree Engineering program and would obtain your degree within 9 months of appointment, you may apply.

YOU WILL BE EXPECTED TO SUBMIT COLLEGE TRANSCRIPTS AT TIME OF APPLICATION. TRANSCRIPTS NEED NOT BE OFFICIAL COPIES; HOWEVER, THEY MUST CONTAIN ALL INFORMATION NECESSARY TO QUALIFY YOU FOR THIS POSITION.

NOTE: If your degree and/or college credit was awarded by an educational institution outside of the United States and its territories, you must provide independent verification of equivalency. You can write to this Department for a list of acceptable companies providing this service; you must pay the required evaluation fee.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:

Required to possess a valid New York State Driver's License to operate a motor vehicle or otherwise demonstrate the ability to meet the transportation needs of the job.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

This is a basic professional engineering position requiring the ability to apply principles of physics, mathematics, mechanics, and materials to engineering and infrastructure related problems. The work requires independent judgment in devising new methods and adapting standard procedures to meet unusual conditions. Work may involve cross department functions with Engineering and Public Works Departments on various infrastructure and project assignments. Work is performed under the direct supervision of the Director of Engineering with some day-to-day leadership from the Senior Civil Engineer, and Director of Public Works or their designee. Supervision may be exercised over the work of subordinates. Attendance at evening meetings of various boards and committees of the Town may be required. The incumbent will perform all related duties as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:

Conducts surveys for road, conduits, etc., map developed areas, and to run location lines for roads, conduits, etc;

Conducts surveys to obtain data on drainage structures guide rail systems, traffic signing, etc.;

Reviews and inspects storm water pollution protection plans submitted to Town;

Supervises construction work on assignment;

Keeps records of amount of work done and of changes in plans and specifications;

Checks design computations and plans of other staff for routine errors;

Works with engineering technicians and students engaged in design surveys and construction inspection;

Supervises and instructs in the use of transits, levels and other surveying instruments;

Drafts plans, topographical and cross-section maps and charts;

Computes and estimates quantities of materials used for determining payments to contractors;

Prepares bid documents for water, sewer, storm water, road projects and other projects as assigned;

Evaluates and acquires products, materials, and services for Engineering and/or Public Works Department;

Completes State Environmental Quality Reviews for water, sewer, storm water and road projects;

Reviews building permit applications, including representing the Town at meetings with applicants and boards.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Good knowledge of the principles of civil engineering, physics and mathematics;

Good knowledge of construction and engineering practices;

Working knowledge of the codes, laws rules, regulations and procedures governing highway and bridge design and construction, and storm water compliance;

Working knowledge of municipal procurement processes;

Skill in the use of surveying and drafting instruments;

Ability to use a computer and many types of software programs such as Microsoft Word, Excel, Access and a variety of mapping and engineering surveying software;

Ability to design moderately difficult engineering projects;

Ability to make difficult technical computations and compile engineering data;

Ability to read and interpret engineering drawings and specifications;

Ability to plan and supervise the work of others;

Ability to operate a variety of surveying instruments (e.g., surveyor's level, theodolite);

Ability to use drafting equipment;

Ability to establish cooperative working relationships with contracts, the public, consultants, vendors, co-workers, and other department staff;

Ability to perform activity requiring physical effort (walking, climbing or reaching);

Ability to perform work requiring prolonged visual concentration;

Resourcefulness, accuracy, alertness, good judgment;

Physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position, either with or without reasonable accommodations.

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Complete Scope of the Examination and Expanded Subtest Descriptions:

Principles and practices of civil engineering

These questions test for knowledge of engineering concepts and their practical applications to the construction, operation and maintenance of public works projects, including roadways, bridges, buildings, water and sewage systems and similar types of infrastructure.

Engineering plans, specifications and estimates

These questions test for knowledge of and the ability to read and interpret construction drawings and technical specifications, and for the ability to calculate cost and quantity estimates from technical presentations and/or engineering and construction drawings. Knowledge of estimating techniques and the proper method of construction for specified projects will be required.

Methods and materials of construction

These questions test for knowledge of the proper procedures and materials used in the construction, maintenance and repair of various types of public works projects, including such typical construction work as excavations, roadways, embankments, and building and related structural improvements.

Test Guide:

The New York State Department of Civil Service has not prepared a test guide for this examination. However, candidates may find information in the publication 'General Guide to Written Tests' helpful in preparing for this test. FURTHER INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

Falsification of any part of the "Application for Employment" will result in disqualification.

Accepted candidates will be notified when and where to appear for the examination. If you do not receive your notice to appear at least three days before the date of the written examination, call Tompkins County Department of Human Resources at 274-5526. If an application is disapproved, due notice will be sent. This department does not make formal acknowledgment of the receipt of an application or take responsibility for non-delivery or postal delay.

Applicants must answer every question on the application form and make sure that the application is complete in all respects. Incomplete applications will be disapproved.

ACTIVE MILITARY PERSONNEL, VETERANS OR DISABLED VETERANS desiring to claim additional credit will request the Veterans Credits application form, at any time between the date of application for examination(s) and the date of the establishment of the resulting eligible list. You must meet the requirements set by NYS for these credits and they may be used only once. **YOU MAY NOT CLAIM ADDITIONAL CREDITS AFTER THE ELIGIBLE LIST HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED. IT IS THE CANDIDATE'S RESPONSIBILITY TO REQUEST THE VETERANS CREDIT APPLICATION FORMS AND TO SUBMIT THESE FORMS AND ANY SUPPORTING PAPERWORK BEFORE THE ELIGIBLE LIST IS ESTABLISHED.**

Tompkins County's written examinations are prepared and rated by the New York State Department of Civil Service in accordance with Section 23-2 of Civil Service Law. The provisions of the New York State Civil Service Rules and Regulations, which deal with the rating and review of the examinations apply.

The duration of the eligible lists may be fixed for a minimum of one and a maximum of four years and may be extended beyond four years if there has been a restriction against the filling of vacancies in that title.

The candidates must complete a separate "Application for Employment" for each open-competitive and/or promotional examination that the candidate is eligible to take.

All experience required meeting the acceptable training and experience is full-time experience. (Part-time experience will be credited on a prorated basis).

Appointment from an eligible list must be made from the top three candidates willing to accept the appointment.

Tompkins County is an Equal Opportunity Employer. As part of its efforts to provide employment opportunities to the physically handicapped, Tompkins County Civil Service has adopted a rule permitting the employment of qualified physically handicapped persons without competitive examination (pursuant to Section 55 of Civil Service Law). Unless otherwise notified, candidates are permitted to use quiet, hand-held, and solar or battery powered calculators. You may not bring books or other reference materials.

CROSS-FILING - APPLYING FOR CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS IN MULTIPLE JURISDICTIONS WHEN EXAMINATIONS ARE SCHEDULED ON THE SAME DATE: When applying for examinations across multiple jurisdictions - all of which are scheduled on the same day - you must submit a Tompkins County Cross-Filing Form. This form must be submitted no later than 4:30 PM on the final filing date of the examination. On this form, list each examination that you are taking and then tell us where you would like to sit. The purpose is to ensure that all of the test materials for the various examinations that you are taking will be available in one location. If you do not provide the cross-filing form to us by the final filing date, we cannot ensure that we can accommodate your desire to cross-file. If any of the examinations are State level examinations, you must sit at the State test center. You will still need to complete the Tompkins County cross-filing form. If sitting at the State site, the State will notify you of when and where to report for your examination(s) and you should bring all admittance letters to the State site. If you are not taking a State examination, bring all admittance letters to your chosen testing site. FOR RELIGIOUS ACCOMMODATION AND HANDICAPPED PERSONS: If special arrangements for testing are required, please indicate this on your application.

ALL CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT FOR POSITIONS IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND BOCES GOVERNED BY TOMPKINS COUNTY CIVIL SERVICE MAY HAVE THE FOLLOWING SPECIAL REQUIREMENT. PER CHAPTER 180 OF THE LAWS OF 2000, AND BY REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION, TO BE EMPLOYED IN A POSITION DESIGNATED BY A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR BOCES AS INVOLVING DIRECT CONTACT WITH STUDENTS, A CLEARANCE FOR EMPLOYMENT FROM THE STATE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT IS REQUIRED.

In conformance with Section 85-a of the Civil Service Law, children of firefighters and police officers killed in the line of duties shall be entitled to receive an additional ten points in a competitive examination for original appointment in the same municipality in which his or her parent has served. If you are qualified to participate in this examination and are a child of firefighter or police officer killed in the line of duties in this municipality, please inform this office of this matter when you submit your application for examination. A candidate claiming such credit has a minimum of two months from the application deadline to provide the necessary documentation to verify additional credit eligibility. However, no credit may be added after the eligible list has been established.â

BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION: Applicants may be required to undergo a State and national criminal history background investigation, which will include a fingerprint check, to determine suitability for appointment. Failure to meet the standards for the background investigation may result in disqualification.
